

WHAT TO USE

- Review your disinfectant product label and select one that meets the following criteria:
 - Has a Drug Identification Number (DIN) or a Natural Product Number (NPN)
 - Is a one step cleaner and disinfectant
 - Has a contact time of 5 minutes or less (time the surface must stay wet)

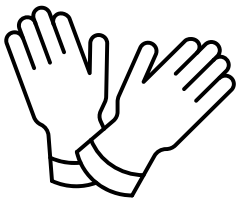
Household bleach (5.25%) can be used as a disinfectant. If used, items and surfaces must be cleaned first using soap and water.

HOW OFTEN TO CLEAN AND DISINFECT SURFACES

- As per Public Health Ontario's Cleaning and Disinfection Schedule **AND** when visibly soiled or during times of increased illness

BEFORE YOU START

- Review the label for key information:



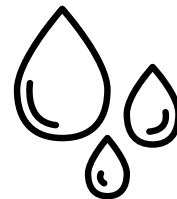
PPE Required



Safe Handling



Contact Time



Rinse Step (if applicable)

DURING CLEANING AND DISINFECTION

- Avoid preparing and using disinfectants close to children
- Pre-clean surfaces that are visibly dirty before cleaning/disinfection
- Do not use a spray bottle. Apply using a squirt top or cloth
- If the surface dries before the contact time is met, reapply the disinfectant
- Use mechanical friction or "elbow grease" when cleaning/disinfecting
- Prioritize "high touch" surfaces and items (i.e. toys, faucet handles, doorknobs)
- Store cleaning/disinfectant products out of reach of children
