

Child Care Protocol When Child/Staff Tests Positive for COVID-19

The purpose of this document is to help child care centre and parents/guardians understand:

- What will public health do if a child/staff tests positive for COVID-19?
- What will the child care centre do if a child/staff test positive for COVID-19?

It also answers the following questions:

- What type of information will the child care centre be asked to provide if staff/child tests positive?
- What type of information will public health provide the child care centre if staff/child tests positive?
- Which information sheet should be provided to parents/guardians?



Child Care Centre Protocol When Child/Staff Tests Positive for COVID-19

Child or staff tests positive for COVID-19 WDGPH contacts the staff, child's parent/guardian to conduct a risk assessment Child Care operator will receive notification from WDGPH Information needed may include: Class/cohort lists Attendance records • Updated contact info for children/staff Child care provides cohort lists for children/staff who tested positive for COVID-• Records of essential visitors/sign-in or visitor logs 19 (as soon as possible) WDGPH will perform risk assessment to identify high-risk and low-risk contacts from the child care setting Child Care will send Child Care Centre Case Information Sheet home to all parents/guardians/staff WDGPH will inform operator of which children/staff are high-risk contacts (HRC) High-risk contacts must follow the guidance from (e.g. class cohort); Note: class may be dismissed if in-progress during the day Public Health for testing, isolation, return to child care 1) Child Care Centre will send WDGPH HRC letter to those identified by guidance, and direction for household members. WDGPH as HRC to provide guidance on self-isolation and testing *Refer to flow chart for high-risk Contacts. recommendations 2) WDGPH will provide child care with recommendations for infection prevention and control measures (if applicable)

Note: Personal health information may be disclosed to child care centres only for contact tracing. Child care centres have an obligation to protect the personal information of their children. Centres are not to disclose the identity of the case. The identity of the case should not be disclosed publicly to parents, or to other children unless deemed necessary by public health or given permission to do so by the case or their guardian.
