Long-Term Care Homes: Updated Rules and Orders

The Government of Ontario has amended orders <u>O.Reg 158/20</u> Limiting Work to a Single Retirement Home (<u>318/21</u>) and <u>O.Reg 146/20</u> Limiting Work to a Single Long-Term Care Home (<u>309/21</u>) to exempt fully immunized long-term care home and retirement home employees from restrictions that prohibit them from working in more than one home or healthcare setting.

Rules regarding admissions and transfers in long-term care homes have also been updated:

- For fully immunized residents with a negative laboratory-based test at the time of admission or transfer, no isolation is required.
- For partially immunized or unimmunized residents, a laboratory-based test is required at the time of admission or transfer, and the resident must isolate for a minimum of 10 days (reduced from 14 days) subject to a negative laboratory test taken on Day 8.

Announcements and Changes to Services

- On April 29, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it will introduce legislation that
 would, if passed, require employers to provide employees with up to \$200 of pay for up
 to three days if they are missing work because of COVID-19. The province will partner
 with the Workplace Safety and Insurance Board to deliver the program and reimburse
 employers up to \$200 per day for each employee. The proposed legislation would also
 enhance the existing <u>Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit</u> available to eligible employees.
- On April 28, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is taking further action to ensure hospital beds are available for COVID-19 patients in need of urgent care.
- On April 28, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is providing \$86 million to help train up to 8,000 personal support workers (PSWs) through private career colleges and district school boards.
- On April 26, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> passed Bill 269, *Protecting the People of Ontario Act (Budget Measures), 2021* and enacted into law the next phase of the province's ongoing response to COVID-19.
- On April 26, the <u>Government of Canada</u> confirmed that it will be providing more help to Ontario in response to the province's request for assistance to support the ongoing fight against the COVID-19 pandemic.
- On April 22, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced new rules for some international travel.
