Ontario Moves into Step One of Roadmap to Reopen on June 11

The province will move into Step One of its <u>Roadmap to Reopen</u> on Friday, June 11. Step One of the Roadmap to Reopen includes, but is not limited to, permitting outdoor social gatherings and organized public events with up to 10 people (with physical distancing in place). Appointment Cancellation Added to Website

People needing to cancel a vaccine appointment can do so by calling the booking helpline, using the cancel button in their appointment email confirmation or by submitting their information into the new <u>Cancel a booked appointment</u> form on the website.

COVID-19 Vaccine Promotion Toolkit

The Ministry of Long-Term Care has created a <u>toolkit</u> for people to use to boost vaccination rates by engaging with colleagues and community on vaccine safety. The kit includes posters, fact sheets, tips for holding effective conversations and sample Facebook and Twitter posts that users can share on their social networks. The toolkit is available in English, French and 10 other languages.

Announcements and Changes to Services

- On June 10, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is further expanding eligibility for accelerated second doses in Delta hot spots to ensure a strong level of protection against COVID-19 and variants.
- On June 9, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it has delivered 12.3 million rapid antigen test kits for COVID-19 to over 2,600 work sites across the province.
- On June 9, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is resuming in-vehicle passenger road tests on Monday, June 14, at DriveTest centres across the province and increasing capacity to address the COVID-19 backlog.
- On June 4, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that as of Monday, June 7, individuals turning ages 70 and over in 2021, as well as individuals who received their first dose of



an mRNA vaccine on or before April 18, 2021, will be eligible to schedule an appointment to receive their second dose of vaccine at a mass immunization clinic.
