## Ontario Remains in Step 3 of the Roadmap to Reopen

In response to evolving data around the Delta variant and based on the recent experiences of other jurisdictions, the government, in consultation with Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health, is pausing the exit from the Roadmap to Reopen. Data will continue to be monitored to determine when it is safe to exit the Roadmap and lift the majority of public health and workplace safety measures currently in place. # **Third Dose Eligibility**

Third doses of a COVID-19 vaccine became available to **specific select populations only** in WDG on Monday, August 23. Visit our website for a list of these <u>eligible groups</u> and who to contact for more information.

# **Mandatory Vaccination Policies in High-Risk Settings**

The Chief Medical Officer of Health has issued a directive mandating hospitals and home and community care service providers to have a COVID-19 vaccination policy for employees, staff, contractors, students and volunteers, and for ambulance services to have a COVID-19 vaccination policy for paramedics. The vaccination policy must be effective no later than September 7, 2021 and require individuals to provide proof of **one** of three things:

- Full vaccination against COVID-19;
- A medical reason for not being vaccinated against COVID-19; or

• Completion of a COVID-19 vaccination educational session.

Those who do not provide proof of full vaccination against COVID-19 will be required to undertake regular antigen testing. These settings will be required to track and report on the implementation of their policies to the provincial government. ### **COVID-19 Vaccinations**

WDG residents age 12 and older, and youth who are turning 12 in 2021 (born in 2009) can continue to <u>book appointments for first and second doses online</u> or <u>over the phone</u>. If preferred, drop-in clinic times and locations are also available.

## **Announcements and Changes to Services**

- On August 24, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) will proceed with the resumption of service at various small marine reporting sites, airports of entry and ferry terminals over the coming days and weeks.
- On August 24, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is continuing its last mile strategy to reach eligible individuals who have yet to receive a first or second dose.
- On August 23, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is investing an additional \$169 million to extend the temporary wage increase for personal support workers and direct support workers.
- On August 19, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is investing in new partnerships in agri-food innovation, to help the industry address pandemic related challenges, ongoing labour shortages, and create new opportunities for growth across the sector.
- On August 17, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it will be offering third doses of a COVID-19 vaccine to select vulnerable populations and expanding eligibility for the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine to all youth turning 12 in 2021.
- On August 16, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is working closely with public health units and school boards to plan and host vaccination clinics in or nearby schools to continue to fight COVID-19.
- On August 13, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced that Canada has entered into an agreement with Moderna for additional supply of its COVID-19 vaccine for 2022 and 2023, with an option to extend into 2024.
- On August 13, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced that more than 2000 local pharmacies have registered to distribute rapid antigen tests to small and medium-sized businesses and non-profit organizations – this includes independent pharmacies, Rexall, Sobeys and Shoppers Drug Mart pharmacies in Ontario.
- On August 13, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced its intent to require vaccination as early as the end of September across the federal public service.
