Amendment to Ontario Regulation 364/20

Ontario Regulation 364/20 was amended to address proof of vaccination requirements as they pertain to persons turning 12 years old in 2022. The requirements to provide proof of vaccination to enter select settings applies to persons 12 years of age and older, as persons under 12 years of age are exempt. The regulation was amended to also exempt persons born in 2010 **and** who are 12 years and 12 weeks of age or younger.

COVID-19 Vaccine for Children Ages 5 to 11

Drop-ins are NOT being accepted for ages 5-11 COVID-19 vaccinations unless a message for a specific date/time has been posted on our social channels. Please make an appointment. Announcements and Changes to Services

- On December 2, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that it is accelerating COVID-19 vaccine booster dose eligibility to Ontarians aged 50 and over and additional high-risk individuals.
- On December 2, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that 90 per cent of Ontarians aged 12 and over have received at least one dose of a COVID-19 vaccine.
- On December 1, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced that the National Centre for Foreign Animal Disease (CFIA) had confirmed the first detections of SARS-CoV-2 in three free-ranging white-tailed deer in Canada.
- On November 30, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced additional border measures to reduce the risk of the importation and transmission of COVID-19 and its variants in Canada related to international travel.
- On November 28, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced the province of Ontario has confirmed two cases of the Omicron variant of COVID-19 in Ottawa.
- On November 26, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced enhanced border measures for all travellers who have been in the Southern Africa region.
- On November 19, <u>Health Canada</u> authorized use of the Comirnaty (the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine) in children 5 to 11 years of age
- On November 19 the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced the adjustment of some of Canada's border measures beginning on Nov. 30 to include additional COVID-19



vaccines accepted for entry to Canada and changes to certain exemptions, testing and ArriveCAN requirements.
