Ontario Extends Emergency Orders

The <u>Government of Ontario</u> has extended all emergency orders currently in force that were made under s.7.0.2 (4) of the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act* until July 10, 2020, while removing restrictions that were limiting access to certain sport training facilities. Please be aware that there is the potential for the Ontario government to extend the orders past this date, if deemed necessary.



Emergency orders include those allowing frontline care providers to redeploy staff to other areas, limiting long-term care and retirement home employees to working at one home, and enabling public health units to redeploy or hire staff to support the province's enhanced case management and contact tracing strategy. Sports and Recreational Fitness Activities

Some facilities for indoor and outdoor sports and recreational fitness activities may open, if they comply with the conditions outlined in <u>Ontario Regulation 263/20 – Stage 2 Closures</u>. Gyms, yoga, dance studios and other fitness facilities remain closed.

Launch of Canada Student Service Grant

The <u>Canada Student Service Grant (CSSG)</u> was launched on June 25. This initiative will support post-secondary students and recent graduates as they volunteer to serve in their communities' COVID-19 response and gain valuable experience at the same time. The CSSG will provide volunteers with a one-time payment of between \$1,000 and \$5,000 based on the number of hours they serve. Students can use the new <u>I Want to Help</u> platform to find opportunities and more information.

COVID-19 Testing

Please go to an <u>Assessment Centre</u> to get tested. Public Health <u>DOES NOT</u> provide testing. No referral is needed. **Bring your health card to the assessment centre** (if you have one). It is OK if it is expired. Presenting your health card allows you to:

- Check your test results online. Public Health only calls those who test positive.
- Be treated or prescribed medication for other respiratory conditions if needed and if this option is available at your assessment centre.
- Move through the testing process faster.

Further instruction will be provided by the clinician at the assessment centre based on individual assessment. Be prepared for increased wait times at the assessment centres. **Please check your local Assessment Centre for holiday hours on July 1 as they may be closed or have reduced hours.**

Face Coverings Required for Commercial Businesses in WDG

Dr. Nicola Mercer, Medical Officer of Health, has issued an order under Section 22 of the *Health Protection and Promotion Act.*

What this means:

• A face covering is required for any customer, patron, employee or visitor when entering and while on the premises of any commercial establishment in the WDG region, effective 12:01 a.m. on June 12, 2020. The order will be in effect until rescinded.

Individuals who may be exempted from this Order:

- Children under the age of two years.
- Children under the age of five years (either chronologically or developmentally) who refuse to wear a face covering and cannot be persuaded to do so by their caregiver.
- People whose ability to breathe in any way is inhibited by the face covering.
- People that have any other medical reason they cannot wear a face covering safely, such as, but not limited to, respiratory disease, cognitive difficulties or difficulties in hearing or processing information.

Health and Safety Sector-Specific Guidance

Sector-specific guidelines and posters to help protect workers and the public from COVID-19 are available from the Government of Ontario. These <u>guidance documents</u> are being posted and updated as they become available, so check back regularly.



Announcements and Changes to Services

- On June 29, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced that the GST/HST and customs duty payment deferral is ending as planned on June 30. Businesses that continue to experience difficulty in remitting GST/HST and customs duty amounts owing can contact the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) and Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) to make a request for the cancellation of penalties and interest, and/or for a flexible payment arrangement with CRA.
- On June 27, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced \$120 million in support of the Access to COVID-19 (ACT) Accelerator – with \$20 million of that total for the Coalition for Epidemic Preparedness Innovations (CEPI). The ACT Accelerator is a global collaboration to accelerate the development, production and equitable distribution of new COVID-19 diagnostics, therapeutics and vaccines. Canada will also invest an additional \$180 million to address the humanitarian and development impacts of the pandemic.
- On June 26, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that they are temporarily providing more stable electricity pricing for large industrial and commercial companies as they return to full levels of operation during the pandemic. Effective immediately, companies that participate in the Industrial Conservation Initiative (ICI) will not be required to reduce their electricity usage during peak hours, as their proportion of <u>Global Adjustment</u> (<u>GA</u>) charges will be frozen.
- On June 26, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced up to \$4 million for the Seniors Community Grant Program. This funding will help non-profit organizations, local services boards, or Indigenous groups develop programs for seniors that focus on combatting social isolation, promoting seniors' safety and well-being, improving financial security and making communities age-friendly.
