Purpose of bulletin: To keep local stakeholders informed of the quickly-evolving novel coronavirus (COVID-19) situation and its implications for Wellington County, Dufferin County and the City of Guelph (WDG).

Local COVID-19 Surveillance

- Number of confirmed positive cases in WDG at this point in time: 6
 - Age range: 20s-90s
 - 4 in Dufferin County, 1 in Wellington County, 1 in City of Guelph
- Total recovered cases WDG: 1
- Total fatal cases in WDG: 0
- On March 26, Guelph General Hospital (GGH) and Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health <u>declared an outbreak of COVID-19 on a ward (4E) at the hospital</u>. The GGH, working with WDG Public Health, is taking immediate measures to protect staff and patients.

WDG Assessment Centre & Case Data

- As of March 25, data about <u>confirmed positive cases of COVID-19 and assessment</u> <u>centre testing</u> in WDG is available online.
- Note: These numbers will be updated as they become available. The number of confirmed cases is only part of the picture. You should assume you can get COVID-19 in the community. For more information, visit <u>www.wdgpublichealth.ca</u>.

New COVID-19 Online Self-Assessment Tool

• The new easy-to-use <u>self-assessment tool</u> asks a series of questions and provides clear direction on action to take. Use the tool if you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19.

New Instructions for Returning from Travel

• On March 25, the <u>Government of Canada announced</u> an Emergency Order under the *Quarantine Act* that **requires mandatory 14-day self isolation for all persons entering Canada** by air, sea or land, even if they do not have symptoms.



Guidelines for Food Premises and Food Delivery and/or Takeout

 Issued March 26, WDGPH released <u>COVID-19 Guidelines for Food Premises and Food</u> <u>Delivery Services Providing Delivery and/or Takeout</u>. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in fines under the Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act that range from \$750.00 to \$1000.00 for an individual and up to \$10,000,000 for a corporation. Announcements and Changes to Services

- On March 26, <u>Government of Ontario announced</u> provision of an additional \$3.3 billion to support frontline health care workers and increase health care capacity in response to the COVID-19 outbreak.
- On March 26, a collection of social and health-care organizations <u>opened the Supported</u> <u>Isolation Centre (SIC)</u> in downtown Guelph, a space where the homeless community can self-isolate amidst COVD-19.
- On March 25, the <u>Premier Ford and Minister Phillips announced</u> additional health care resources and support for people, jobs and employers.
- On March 25, the <u>Government of Ontario launched</u> a Stop the Spread Business Information Line at 1-888-444-3659 to provide support to Ontario businesses who have questions about the province's recent order to close at-risk workplaces.
