- Patients/clients with COVID-19
- Patients/clients with non-COVID-19 health care needs
- Patients/clients who may have been impacted by delayed or deferred care during the first wave of the COVID-19 pandemic

WDGPH Virtual School Community Update (October 22)

Announcements and Changes to Services

- On October 26, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it will release its 2020 Budget on Thursday, November 5, focusing on protecting the health and safety of people during the pandemic, providing supports to families, workers, and employers, and laying the foundation for future growth, renewal and economic recovery.
- On October 26, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced that the Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) will be available to businesses that have been operating out of a non-business banking account.
- On October 23, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is investing over \$5 million to help food rescue organizations, First Nation communities and Indigenous organizations purchase refrigerated trucks, freezers, storage space and kitchen equipment so they can safely collect, preserve and distribute unused, high-quality surplus food from places like grocery stores and restaurants to those in need during COVID-19 and beyond, ensuring fresh food does not go to waste.
- On October 23, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced that the deadline to apply for the <u>Disability Tax Credit</u> (DTC) to receive the one-time payment has been extended from September 25, 2020, to December 31, 2020.
- On October 23, the <u>Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau</u>, announced an investment of up to \$173 million through the Strategic Innovation Fund (SIF) in Quebec City-based Medicago to support Canada's response to COVID-19 and future preparedness.
- On October 22, the <u>Government of Canada and Government of Alberta</u> announced a joint pilot program the first of its kind in the country that will safely test an alternative to the current 14-day quarantine requirement for international travellers while continuing to protect Canadians from COVID-19.

Face Coverings

On October 2 (<u>see News Release</u>), the Ontario government announced that when you go out anywhere in Ontario, you must use a face covering (non-medical mask, such as a cloth mask) in public indoor spaces and whenever physical distancing is a challenge. This includes <u>public spaces</u>, <u>workplaces and vehicles that operate as part of a business or organization</u>, with some exceptions.

COVID Alert App

The <u>Government of Ontario</u> is encouraging Ontarians to download <u>COVID Alert</u> on their smartphones. The free, nation-wide app notifies users of potential exposure to COVID-19.



Users who test positive for COVID-19 will receive a one-time key from their health authority that they can enter in the app. When the key is entered, COVID Alert will notify other users who may have come in close contact with that person for at least 15 minutes in the past 14 days so they can contact their local public health authority for guidance.

The app uses strong measures to protect data and does not track a user's location or collect personally identifiable information. The Privacy Commissioners of Canada and Ontario were consulted on the development of COVID Alert to ensure the highest level of privacy for users.

COVID-19 Testing

Please check your local <u>assessment centre</u> for details on booking an appointment. Public Health <u>DOES NOT</u> provide testing. No referral is needed. **Bring your health card to the assessment centre** (if you have one). It is OK if it is expired. Presenting your health card allows you to:

- Check your test results online. Public Health only calls those who test positive.
- Be treated or prescribed medication for other respiratory conditions if needed and if this
 option is available at your assessment centre.
- Move through the testing process faster.

Further instruction will be provided by the clinician at the assessment centre based on individual assessment.

If you are asymptomatic a list of pharmacies, currently providing testing, is available at the Ontario COVID-19 testing locations finder website.

Check Your COVID-19 Test Results Online

COVID-19 test results are available <u>online</u>. If you receive a positive result you will have the option to report your information to Public Health through Contact +. Contact + is a voluntary, web-based service. **It does not replace the call you get from Public Health**. Contact + allows you to confirm your contact details as well as review and answer the questions that Public Health will ask you, in advance of your call. You may add this information for up to 48 hours after your positive test result is reported. For more information about Contact + visit the <u>testing and results</u> page.
