Current WDG Zone Level: Provincewide Shutdown – Grey, (O. Reg. 82/20)

Please note that <u>Ontario Regulation 82/20</u> was amended on January 14, 2021 to include the additional measures announced by the <u>Government of Ontario</u>, as outlined in <u>Enhancing Public</u> Health and Workplace Safety Measures in the Provincewide Shutdown.

Information for School Boards and Private Schools

Earlier today, the Government of Ontario announced additional school boards in public health unit regions that may resume in-person learning on February 1. **Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health was not included in this list and therefore all public and private schools in WDG have been directed to continue with remote learning at this time.** School staff who can work from home will continue to be asked to do so. Only students with special education needs who cannot be accommodated through remote learning may attend a school for inperson instruction.

School closure announcements are directed by the province and WDGPH is unable to open schools without the approval from the province. The <u>news release</u> from the Government of Ontario is available online.

Announcements and Changes to Services

- On January 27, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is extending electricity rate relief for families, small businesses and farms to support those spending more time at home in response to the provincial Stay-at-Home Order.
- On January 27, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is expanding provincewide inspections to farms, greenhouses and other agricultural operations to ensure health and safety measures are being followed to protect workers from COVID-19.



- On January 26, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is calling on the federal government to take further action to protect the border, including mandatory testing of all incoming international passengers and a temporary ban on direct flights from countries where new variants are detected.
- On January 26, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is investing over \$40 million during COVID-19 to help small and rural municipalities improve the delivery of critical programs and services.
