Vaccines offered



Meningococcal

The MenC-ACYW vaccine helps prevent meningitis, a serious infection that can affect the brain and spinal cord. It spreads easily and can be life-threatening.

This vaccine protects against four of the most common strains A, C, Y and W135.



Hepatitis B

This vaccine protects against liver cancer and liver disease caused by the hepatitis B virus.

This vaccine is often required or recommended for travel, post-secondary school and certain jobs.



HPV

The HPV-9 vaccine helps protect against cancers of the head, neck, and genital areas, as well as warts.

It protects against nine common types of HPV. Many people come into contact with HPV at some point in their lives.

What you need to do

Please complete the online consent form for your child as soon as possible. This lets the public health nurse know if your child can receive the vaccines.

If your child has already received any of these vaccines, you can note that on the form.


Helping your child feel comfortable on vaccination day

CARD stands for:




Ask – Encourage your child to ask questions about what will happen.

Relax – Practice deep breaths or calming thoughts together.

Distract – Use a device, read, or chat with a friend to take their mind off it.

HPV Vaccine

Protects Against Cancer



What does this vaccine do?

Most people will be in contact with human papillomavirus (HPV) in their lifetime. The HPV vaccine protects against 9 common high-risk strains of HPV. These strains can cause:

- . Head and neck cancer
 - . Anal cancer . Penile cancer
- Cervical and vaginal cancers
- . Genital warts
- 3 reasons to get the HPV vaccine at school

It works!

A complete HPV vaccine series can prevent:

- · Over 90% of cervical cancers and genital warts.
- · Most anal, vaginal, vulvar, penile, mouth and throat cancers.

Hepatitis B Vaccine

Protects Against Liver Infections



The Hepatitis B vaccine will be offered at school to **students (all genders)** who are 12-13 years old. It's most effective when given at an early age, before exposure and when the immune response is stronger. The vaccine is free for all students until the end of Grade 12.

What does this vaccine do?

The **hepatitis B vaccine** protects against the hepatitis B virus, which can cause **liver damage**, **liver cancer or even death**. Hepatitis B is the leading cause of liver cancer in Canada.

3 reasons to get the hepatitis B vaccine at school

It works!

1 in 10 people who are infected with hepatitis B will carry it for life. Getting vaccinated is the best way to avoid long-term health risks. The hepatitis B vaccine is very effective and protects 98% of people when given in the recommended number or doses.

It's safe!

The hepatitis B vaccine has been carefully tested and it's safety is continuously monitored. Reactions are usually mild. It is much safer for your child to get the vaccine than to get hepatitis B.

It's easy!

A nurse will come to your child's school to give the hepatitis B vaccine—no need to book an appointment or take time off. Simply complete the online consent form. Protects against liver disease and liver cancer

MenC-ACYW Vaccine

Protects Against Meningococcal Disease



This vaccine will be offered at school to **students (all genders) who are 12-13 years old.** It's most effective when given at an early age, before exposure and when the immune response is stronger. The vaccine is **free for all students until the end of Grade 12.**

What does this vaccine do?

The MenC-ACYW vaccine protects your child from meningococcal disease, a life-threatening bacterial infection that can cause **deafness**, **seizures**, **brain damage**, **loss of limbs**, **or even death**.

3 reasons to get this vaccine at school

It works!

The MenC-ACYW vaccine is 80-85% effective at preventing meningococcal disease. The infection spreads easily through coughing, sneezing, or sharing food and drinks. About 1 in 100 people who get this disease do not survive.

It's safe!

The vaccine has been carefully tested and it's safety is continuously monitored. Reactions are usually mild. It is much safer for your child to get the vaccine than to get meningococcal disease.

It's easy!
