Re: Boards of Health – Order in Council Appointments

On behalf of the Boards of Health Section of the Association of Local Public Health Agencies (alPHa), we are writing to you with regards to the inconsistency with which Order-in-Council appointments to local boards of health under Section 49 of the *Health Protection and Promotion Act* have been made over the past year.

This came to our attention late last year, with many of our Boards who depend on provincial appointees to maintain their necessary complement reporting that their requests for appointments were not responded to, not approved or approved for only a limited time. In no case was any explanation provided and several of the short-term reappointments have since expired, requiring new requests that have thus far been met with silence.

This inconsistency is having a detrimental effect on the governance and accountability roles of local boards. The uncertainty, interruption of continuity and simple depletion of the ranks are compromising the capacity for sound decision-making on local public health matters in many areas. This is of particular concern at this time as boards of health throughout Ontario have key roles and responsibilities in engaging with their respective public health units, local councils, and community partners in the fight against COVID-19.

We appreciate the challenges of the current moment, but we would respectfully observe that it is precisely because of these challenges that Ontario's Boards of Health require stability and consistency with respect to membership and we need the Province to do its part with timely appointments without arbitrarily truncated terms to the boards who rely on them.

We hope that all current requests for approval will be addressed without further delay and all future requests will be responded to with the urgency that these warrant.
