Announcements and Changes to Services

- On April 27, the <u>Government of Ontario launched</u> the <u>COVID-19: Tackling the</u>
 <u>Barriers</u> website to **help businesses** overcome the unique challenges created by the
 global pandemic. Businesses working to retool their operations to produce health-related
 products, or those that want to continue their operations in this new environment of
 physical distancing, can submit any potential roadblocks to the website
- On April 27, the <u>Government of Ontario released</u> a <u>Framework for Reopening our Province</u>, which outlines the criteria Ontario's Chief Medical Officer of Health and health experts will use to advise the government on the loosening of emergency measures, as well as guiding principles for the safe, gradual reopening of businesses, services and public spaces. The framework also provides details of an outreach strategy, led by the Ontario Jobs and Recovery Committee, to help inform the restart of the provincial economy.
- On April 27, the <u>Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) launched</u> the <u>application process</u> for the **Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS)** on behalf of the Government of Canada to help employers keep and re-hire workers amidst COVID-19. As of today, employers can apply for the CEWS through <u>My Business Account</u> or through the CRA's <u>online application portal</u>, and their representatives can apply through <u>Represent a</u> Client.
- On April 26, the <u>Ministry of Education announced</u> that all publicly-funded schools will remain closed until at least May 31, 2020, as part of an effort to keep students, staff and families safe from COVID-19. For more information, visit the news release.
- On April 25, the <u>Government of Ontario announced</u> frontline staff will be provided with a temporary pandemic payment in recognition of the dedication, long hours and increased risk of working to contain the COVID-19 outbreak.
 - Amount: \$4/hour worked on top of regular wages and monthly lump sum payments of \$250 for four months to eligible frontline workers who work over 100 hours per month – meaning eligible employees working an average of 40 hours per week would receive \$3,560 in additional compensation.
 - o Duration: Effective for 16 weeks, from April 24, 2020 until August 13, 2020.
 - Eligibility: Staff working in long-term care homes, retirement homes, emergency shelters, supportive housing, social services congregate care settings, corrections institutions and youth justice facilities, as well as those providing home and community care and some staff in hospitals. Staff providing frontline



clinical services, along with those providing support services, such as cleaning and meal preparation, will be eligible to receive the pandemic payment. For more information about eligible workplaces and workers, visit the <u>pandemic pay</u> backgrounder.

- On April 25, the <u>Government of Ontario extended</u> the closure of Ontario's provincial parks and conservation reserves to May 31, 2020. This includes car camping, backcountry camping, roofed accommodations, day use opportunities, access points and all public buildings.
- On April 25, the <u>Government of Ontario introduced</u> new emergency orders and amended existing emergency orders to:
 - Allow health service providers, including hospitals, to temporarily reassign
 frontline staff to provide services and supports in long-term care homes. This
 will help to quickly provide much-needed staffing support to long-term care
 homes while they continue to fight outbreaks.
 - Provide staffing flexibility to service providers and employers in the intervenor services sector, which helps people who have a combined loss of hearing and vision. This will give employers the temporary authority to redirect staff to carry out essential tasks to support and protect people who are deafblind. It will also ensure staffing measures are in place to allow for physical distancing.
 - Permit the use of allotment gardens and community gardens across the province. These gardens are an essential source of fresh food for some individuals and families, including those who face food insecurity. Local medical officers of health will provide advice, recommendation and instructions that the gardens must meet in order to operate, such as physical distancing, and cleaning and disinfecting commonly used equipment and surfaces.
- On April 24, the Ministry of Agriculture, Food and Rural Affairs announced the
 governments of Canada and Ontario an investment of \$2.5 million to grow agri-food ebusiness. The Agri-Food Open for E-Business initiative will help food producers,
 farmers markets, retailers, garden centres, greenhouses, nurseries, and agricultural
 associations develop online business, providing consumers with greater access to a
 wide variety of food and agriculture products.
- On April 24, the <u>Government of Ontario issued</u> an emergency order for certain congregate care settings, placing a limit on work locations for staff.
