Announcements and Changes to Services

- On May 4, the Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, joined other global leaders to launch the <u>Coronavirus Global Response</u>. This online pledging event aims to initially raise more than \$8 billion (USD) to help researchers and innovators develop solutions to test, treat, and prevent the further spread of COVID-19.
- On May 4, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced significant increases to daily lab testing for COVID-19. Ontario is now exceeding their target of 16,000 tests a day. Testing is being carried out in hospitals, long-term care homes, group homes, shelters, emergency child care centres, and other congregate settings. Labs are generally providing test results within 24 to 48 hours.
- On May 3, <u>Public Services and Procurement Canada</u> announced the creation of the <u>COVID-19 Supply Council</u> to provide the government with advice on the procurement of critical goods and services required as part of Canada's COVID-19 response and recovery.
- On May 3, the Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, highlighted that families receiving the Canada Child Benefit (CCB) will get \$300 extra per child in May to help them deal with the added pressures of COVID-19. Eligible families will automatically receive this onetime increase as part of their scheduled CCB payment.
- On May 3, the Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau, announced an investment of \$240.5 million to develop virtual care and mental health tools to support Canadians. This investment will be used to create digital platforms and applications, improve access to virtual mental health supports, and expand capacity to deliver health care virtually. These supports will help ease the burden on our health care system, as we continue to deal with COVID-19.
- On May 3, <u>Innovation</u>, <u>Science and Economic Development Canada</u> announced that the federal government will be providing \$175M to the British Columbia firm, AbCellera Biologics Inc, to support the development of COVID-19 treatments. The company has been examining the antibodies generated in response to the coronavirus and expects to begin human clinical trials this July to test new treatments.
- On May 1, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> passed an emergency order to defer a portion of Global Adjustment (GA) charges for industrial and commercial electricity consumers that do not participate in the Regulated Price Plan. This initiative is intended to provide



- companies with temporary immediate relief on their monthly electricity bills in April, May and June 2020 due to COVID-19.
- On May 1, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> issued new temporary emergency orders to support hospitals to better manage health care human resources during the COVID-19 outbreak. these orders will:
 - give hospitals the authority to grant privileges to medical and other professional staff in order to address potential surge volumes due to COVID-19, thus allowing a reduction in administrative processes and enabling hospitals to focus their resources on frontline services;
 - authorize coroners, registered nurses appointed as coroner investigators, and public health units to access provincial electronic health records to help reduce demands on clinicians' time related to death investigations, reduce exposure to COVID-19 related death investigations, and improve the ability to monitor the spread of the virus; and
 - allow registered nurses appointed as coroner investigators to complete medical certificates of death instead of a physician or nurse practitioner so that medical professionals have more time to focus on patient care.
