Changes to Testing Criteria from the Ontario Government

Effective immediately, testing is available for people who are concerned they may have been exposed to COVID-19. No referral or appointment is needed to be tested at an assessment centre located in WDG. New asymptomatic, risk-based testing includes:

- People who are contacts of or may have been exposed to a confirmed or suspected
 case.
- People who are at high-risk of exposure to COVID-19 through their employment, including essential workers (health care workers, grocery store employees, food processing plants, etc.)



The Ministry of Health's <u>COVID-19 Reference Document for Symptoms</u> has been updated to include some additional language around how multisystem inflammatory vasculitis may present in children.

Announcements and Changes to Services

- On May 25, the <u>Prime Minister</u>, <u>Justin Trudeau</u> announced that applications are now being accepted for Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance (CECRA) for small businesses. Over the course of the program, property owners will reduce rent by at least 75 per cent for the months of April and May (retroactive), and June, for their small business tenants. CECRA will cover 50 per cent of the rent, with the tenant paying up to 25 per cent and the property owner forgiving at least 25 per cent.
- On May 25, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced the launch of a four-week hotline service called the Business Resilience Service. This service will help entrepreneurs and small business owners in need of financial planning advice, particularly those who may not have access to an accountant. The service will also be open to not-for-profit organizations and charities. Small business owners with pressing financial needs can call 1-866-989-1080 (toll-free) seven days a week, from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. (ET).
- On May 22, the <u>Government of Canada</u> announced a web-based benefits finder tool, <u>Find financial help during COVID-19</u> to help people living in Canada determine which government benefits programs best meet their needs. The tool provides individuals with information on federal, provincial and territorial benefits programs available.
- On May 22, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced an investment into Virtual Action Centre, an online counselling and training portal, to support hospitality workers laid off or unemployed due to COVID-19. The portal will also assist apprentices by providing grants



- to purchase tools, protective equipment and clothing for their trade, along with forgiving previous loans to purchase tools.
- On May 22, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that the province is permitting
 Ontario corporations to conduct virtual meetings and to defer certain annual meetings in
 specified circumstances and is allowing the Ministry of Government and Consumer
 Services to accept copies of documents, electronic signatures on documents, and
 electronic filing of documents. These changes are part of COVID-19 Response and
 Reforms to Modernize Ontario Act. 2020.
- On May 21, the Government of Ontario announced funding research on preventing, detecting and treating COVID-19.
