Announcements and Changes to Services

- On June 1, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that it will support electricity customers by providing:
 - \$9 million for the COVID-19 Energy Assistance Program (CEAP) to support consumers struggling to pay their energy bills during the pandemic.
 - \$8 million for the COVID-19 Energy Assistance Program for Small Business (CEAP-SB) to provide support to businesses struggling with bill payments as a result of the outbreak; and
 - An extension of the Ontario Energy Board's winter disconnection ban until July 31, 2020 to ensure no one is disconnected from their natural gas or electricity service.
- On June 1, the <u>Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau</u> announced that funding delivered through the federal Gas Tax Fund will be accelerated this year to help communities as quickly as possible. Annual federal infrastructure funding for communities will be delivered in one payment in June. Early delivery of the full funding for 2020-21 will help communities quickly move forward with infrastructure projects that will help restart local economies.



- On June 1, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced a new regulatory amendment that will
 put non-unionized employees on <u>Infectious Disease Emergency Leave</u> during the
 COVID-19 outbreak any time their hours of work are temporarily reduced by their
 employer due to COVID-19. This will ensure businesses aren't forced to terminate
 employees after their ESA temporary layoff periods have expired.
- On May 31, the <u>Minister of Economic Development and Official Languages</u>, announced that the <u>Tourism Industry Association of Ontario (TIAO)</u> will receive \$30 million in FedDev Ontario RRRF funding to provide financial relief to destination marketing organizations (DMOs) across southern Ontario that have experienced significant revenue shortfalls due to COVID-19.
- On May 31, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that backcountry camping will be available at Ontario Parks as of June 1, including access points, paddle and portage routes and hiking trails. Ontario Parks will also be expanding day-use activities to include picnicking and off-leash pet areas.
- On May 30, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> made amendments to the <u>Retirement Homes Act</u>, 2010 regulation, enabling the Retirement Homes Regulatory Authority (RHRA) to better support seniors living in retirement homes during the COVID-19 outbreak. The change increases the RHRA emergency payment to eligible retirement home residents from \$2,000 to \$3,500. In the event of an emergency, this funding can be used to cover costs for transportation, alternative accommodation or temporary care. The regulation change also requires retirement homes to report infectious disease outbreaks to the RHRA during COVID-19 and beyond.
- On May 30, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> also announced regulatory changes were also
 made to extend an emergency order to provide electricity bill relief for industrial and
 commercial consumers through to the end of June 2020. It was also announced that
 drive-in movie theatres and batting cages would be allowed to open effective May 31,
 2020. Drive-in cinemas and drive-in religious services can now allow the use of
 washrooms provided health and safety requirements are followed.
- On May 30, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that a fixed electricity price, known as the COVID-19 Recovery Rate, of 12.8 cents per kWh, will be automatically applied to all time-of-use customers 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This fixed electricity price will be in place from June 1 October 31, 2020.
- On May 29, the <u>Minister of Transport</u> announced updated measures, due to COVID-19, pertaining to cruise ships and passenger vessels in Canadian waters.
 - Cruise ships with overnight accommodations allowed to carry more than
 100 persons are prohibited from operating in Canadian waters until October 31,
 2020.
 - As of July 1, 2020, all other passenger vessels must follow provincial, territorial, local and regional health authority requirements for timelines and processes to resume operations.
- On May 29, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> implemented the next phase of its COVID-19 testing plan, <u>Protecting Ontarians Through Enhanced Testing</u>. This phase includes significant expansion of testing of symptomatic and asymptomatic individuals and increased proactive surveillance testing to detect outbreaks and monitor spread among vulnerable populations.



- On May 29, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> in partnership with the federal government, launched Canada Emergency Commercial Rent Assistance (CECRA) for small businesses. The province is committing \$241 million to the program, which will provide more than \$900 million in support for small businesses across Ontario during the pandemic. - On May 29, the <u>City of Guelph</u> announced that City of Guelph summer camps, recreation programs, permits and events at City facilities are cancelled until September 8, 2020.
- On May 28, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced the extension of the mandate of the Incident Management System Long-Term Care Table, which has been coordinating operational support to long-term care homes since April. The table is comprised of health care professionals who make immediate decisions to address issues related to staffing levels, infection management and resources during the COVID-19 outbreak.
- On May 27, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that long-term care inspection teams have been deployed to conduct comprehensive, detailed inspections at high-risk long-term care homes over the next 21 days.
