Check Your COVID-19 Test Results Online

The Ontario government has launched an online <u>COVID-19 Test Result Viewer</u>. This offers fast and secure access to test results on your computer or mobile device. NOTE: Online test results are only available to those with an Ontario photo (green) health card.

If you receive a positive result via the online COVID-19 Test Result Viewer, you will have the option to report your information to Public Health through Contact +. Contact + is a voluntary, web-based service for positive results received via the COVID-19 Test Result Viewer. It does not replace the call you get from Public Health. Contact + allows you to confirm your contact details as well as review and answer the questions that Public Health will ask you, in advance of your call. You may add this information for up to 14 days after your positive test result is reported. For more information about Contact +, visit our Testing and Results page.

Announcements and Changes to Services

- On July 20, <u>Finance Minister</u>, <u>Bill Morneau</u> introduced in Parliament, <u>Bill C-20</u>, <u>An Act respecting further COVID-19 measures</u> which if passed, would make the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy more targeted, expand eligibility and help more workers get back to their jobs as the economy continues to reopen.
- On July 20, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced it is allowing seven more regions to enter Stage 3 on Friday, increasing the number of businesses and public spaces that will reopen across the province.
- On July 17, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> unveiled the second round of research projects approved and supported through the \$20 million <u>Ontario COVID-19 Rapid Research</u> Fund.
- On July 17, <u>The Ministry of Long-Term Care</u> announced it is appointing Humber River Hospital as interim manager at Villa Colombo in North York to help contain the COVID-19 outbreak.
- On July 16, the <u>Government of Ontario</u> announced that it is taking steps to extend the
 expiry period of most marriage licences that have not been used due to the COVID-19
 outbreak.
- On July 16, the Prime Minister, Justin Trudeau announced a federal investment of more than \$19 billion to help provinces and territories safely restart their economies and make Canada more resilient to possible future waves of COVID-19.

COVID-19 Testing



Please go to an <u>Assessment Centre</u> to get tested. Public Health <u>DOES NOT</u> provide testing. No referral is needed. **Bring your health card to the assessment centre** (if you have one). It is OK if it is expired. Presenting your health card allows you to:

- Check your test results online. Public Health only calls those who test positive.
- Be treated or prescribed medication for other respiratory conditions if needed and if this
 option is available at your assessment centre.
- Move through the testing process faster.

Further instruction will be provided by the clinician at the assessment centre based on individual assessment. Be prepared for increased wait times at the assessment centres.

Face Coverings Required for Commercial Businesses in WDG

Dr. Nicola Mercer, Medical Officer of Health, has issued an order under Section 22 of the *Health Protection and Promotion Act*.

What this means:

 A face covering is required for any customer, patron, employee or visitor when entering and while on the premises of any commercial establishment in the WDG region. The order will be in effect until rescinded.

Individuals who may be exempted from this Order:

- Children under the age of two years.
- Children under the age of five years (either chronologically or developmentally) who refuse to wear a face covering and cannot be persuaded to do so by their caregiver.
- People whose ability to breathe is in any way inhibited by the face covering.
- People that have any other medical reason they cannot wear a face covering safely, such as, but not limited to, respiratory disease, cognitive difficulties or difficulties in hearing or processing information.
