

Guidance for Campers/Staff who are High Risk Contacts of a Confirmed Positive COVID-19 Case

*Campers/staff who are high-risk contacts (HRC) of a positive COVID-19 case will receive a letter from Public Health with guidance and directions.

Purpose: To be used when anyone in the household receives notification from Public Health that they are a high-risk contact of a confirmed COVID-19 case. All HRC must self-isolate immediately.
