- Subject: Accessing Multiple Vials to Complete a Dose of Pfizer BioNTech and Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine
- **Date:** June 1, 2021

During this time of limited COVID-19 vaccine supply, an additional dose may be obtained from up to 3 COVID-19 vaccine vials with residual vaccine. Although this is not routine practice, access to additional doses will increase the number of Ontarians who can benefit from vaccine in a timely manner. Proper procedures must be followed to ensure that the safety and quality of the vaccine is not affected.

Procedure:

- Only a trained and dedicated mixer should be drawing up COVID-19 vaccine.
- Aseptic technique must be strictly adhered to. Vial stoppers must be cleaned prior to every puncture.
- A **maximum of 3 vials** with residual vaccine may be accessed to extract one additional dose.
- COVID-19 vaccine vials used for an additional dose must all have the same lot number.
- If using Pfizer, the vaccine mst have been mixed with diluent from the same lot number.
- A mixer must use the most recent expiry time when calculating how long the additional dose is valid for.
- Where possible a mixer should use a LDV syringe and 1" Smart Slip needle to increase their ability to obtain an additional dose.
- Once the pooled dose is obtained, the mixer must change the needle tip prior to the dose being administered.
- Do not save up vials until the end the clinic before combining for an extra dose. The different vials accessed must have been under the same vaccine storage and handling conditions.
- Clinic staff must keep track of the additional doses obtained during a COVID-19 vaccination clinic for inventory purposes and report accordingly.
