**SUBJECT:** COVID-19 Booster Doses – Updates regarding Second Boosters

On April 6, 2022, the Government of Ontario [announced expanded eligibility<sup>1</sup>](#) for second COVID-19 booster doses (i.e., fourth doses) to individuals aged 60 and over as well as First Nation, Inuit and Métis individuals and their non-Indigenous household members aged 18 and over. This builds upon the existing work to offer second boosters to residents of long-term care homes and other congregate settings, which began this winter. The optimal interval for a second booster is five months (140 days) following the first booster. However, eligible individuals can choose to receive it as early as three months (84 days) following the first booster with informed consent.

Moderately or severely immunocompromised individuals who are eligible for a three-dose primary series are not presently eligible for a second booster (i.e., a fifth dose). However, it is particularly important that these individuals receive their first booster (i.e., fourth dose).

The expanded eligibility for second boosters follows the release of [new guidance from the National Advisory Committee on Immunization \(NACI\)<sup>2</sup>](#). Additional information can also be found in the [updated Ministry of Health guidance<sup>3</sup>](#) regarding booster doses.

Eligible individuals have three options for accessing their booster dose:

1. Booking an appointment with their primary care provider
2. Visiting any [pharmacy that offers COVID-19 vaccines](#)
3. Booking an appointment at a Public Health clinic online ([wdgpublichealth.ca/appointments](https://wdgpublichealth.ca/appointments)) or by calling 1-800-265-7293 x7006 (Monday – Friday; 9 A.M. – 4 P.M.)
