• Influenza vaccine will be available to order from WDGPH the week of October 6.

 COVID-19 vaccines will be available to order from WDGPH close to October 6 (exact date not available).

Influenza

Influenza vaccines available to order this season include:

Product	Product Type	Dosage	Packaging	Ages
Fluviral	Trivalent (TIV)	0.5ml	Multidose vial (10)	≥ 6 months
Fluzone	Trivalent (TIV)	0.5ml	10 single-dose pre-filled syringes or Multidose vial (10)	≥ 6 months
Fluzone High Dose	Trivalent, high dose (TIV-HD)	0.5ml	5 single-dose pre-filled syringes	≥65 years
Fluad	Adjuvanted trivalent (TIV-Adj)	0.5ml	10 single-dose pre-filled syringes	≥65 years

Please note that **quadrivalent vaccines are not available this season**. The B/Yamagata flu lineage has not been detected globally since 2020 and is no longer recommended for vaccines.¹

COVID-19

Health Canada has approved updated COVID-19 vaccines targeting the LP.8.1 lineage.

Dose	10 mcg (0.3 mL)	30 mcg (0.3 mL)	25 mcg (0.25 mL)	50 mcg (0.5 mL)
Packaging	Single-dose vial	Multidose vial (6) Prefilled syringe	Multidose vial (10)	Multidose vial (5) Prefilled syringe

Please note that Moderna is the only vaccine that can be used for all age groups ≥6 mo.

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Children under 5 years old who have not yet been immunized should receive a 2-dose Moderna primary series, with the doses given 8 weeks apart.

For anyone receiving a booster, the minimum interval is **3 months** from the most recent dose.

Ordering

Initial doses will be prioritized for:

- Long-term care homes
- Retirement homes
- Hospitals
- Primary care providers

Please order using the <u>WDG Public Health Vaccine Portal</u> (for influenza only) or fax a completed **Vaccine Order Form** (attached) to **519-823-4903**. WDGPH will work directly with long-term care homes and retirement homes to coordinate vaccine distribution.

Flu and COVID vaccines may be co-administered with each other and with other routine vaccines.
