

COVID-19 Vaccine Bulletin 33 Updated Guidance & Youth Vaccine Hesitancy

Quick Updates

- Check out <u>Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph's vaccination dashboard</u>. The total number of doses administered in Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph (WDG) is 395,152.
- Anyone who requires a **FIRST DOSE or SECOND DOSE can now DROP-IN at any of the WDGPH clinic sites** during clinic hours. See <u>clinic locations/times on website</u>.
- As WDG moves into the next phase of the local vaccination program, WDGPH will begin closing its mass vaccination clinics in August. Any individuals who have appointments after the closing dates will be contacted and rescheduled for an earlier appointment or at another clinic. Smaller clinics including pop-up clinics will continue to be offered throughout the region into the fall. The last date for each mass vaccination clinic will be:
 - August 6, 2021 University of Guelph (50 South Ring Rd, Guelph)
 - August 11, 2021 Linamar/Skyjack (201 Woodlawn Rd W., Guelph)
 - August 20, 2021 West End Recreation Centre (21 Imperial Rd S, Guelph), Alder Arena (275 Alder St, Orangeville), Centre-Wellington Community Sportsplex (550 Belsyde Ave E, Fergus)
- A new tab on the vaccination dashboard now shows the vaccination rates at WDG secondary schools and can be viewed <u>here</u>.
- With an anticipated first day of school on September 7, 2021—students should receive their first dose no later than **JULY 29** and their second dose no later than **AUGUST 25**, for full protection against COVID-19 on the first day of school.

Guidance for Fully Vaccinated

- Reminder of the Ministry of Health guidance document: <u>COVID-19 Fully Vaccinated</u> <u>Individuals: Case, Contact and Outbreak Management Interim Guidance</u>.
- <u>WDGPH's After Testing Guidance</u> document as also been updated to reflect new guidance for fully vaccinated individuals.
- Note that these <u>Ontario screening tools</u> have also been updated to reflect new guidance for fully vaccinated individuals. Further updates expected soon.

Youth and Vaccine Hesitancy

- Researchers from the Childhood Adversity and Resilience Research Team at the University of Manitoba conducted a study of 664 people aged **16 to 21 years old** looking at the intentions to get the COVID-19 vaccine and reasons for hesitancy. Data was collected between November and December 2020.
- In the study sample, 65.4% indicated a willingness to get the vaccine, 26.1% were unsure, and 8.5% said they would not get a vaccine.
- The top three reasons that the participants gave for being unsure or unwilling to get the vaccine were concerns about safety, lack of knowledge about the vaccine and concerns about effectiveness.
- Males were more likely to indicated not being concerned about getting COVID-19. Females were more likely to report that they did not have enough information about the vaccine to make a decision.
- Unwillingness to get a vaccine was related to lower parent education, lower household income and lower self-reported knowledge of COVID-19.
