

COVID-19 Vaccine Bulletin #35 Vaccine Updates

Quick Updates

- The <u>WDGPH Vaccination Report</u> now reports the vaccination progress by municipality (click on "municipality" tab at the top of the dashboard).
- The <u>WDGPH COVID-19 Status Report</u> now reports the rate of cases by vaccination status. Click on "Trends" tab on top and then "Vacc. Status" tab on right hand side.
- Anyone born in 2009 or earlier can access COVID-19 vaccine:
 - 1. DROP-IN at any of the WDGPH clinic sites: wdgpublichealth.ca/drop-ins OR
 - 2. Book an appointment online: wdgpublichealth.ca/appointments OR
 - 3. Book an appointment over the phone: 1-800-265-7293, x7006 (Mon-Fri, 8am-4pm) OR
 - 4. Contact a participating pharmacy.
- WDGPH recommends that all employers in WDG implement COVID-19 a vaccination policy in their workplace. More information is available on our website: wdgpublichealth.ca/workplaces.
- The Government of Ontario is requiring proof of vaccination status to access certain businesses and settings starting September 22. More information is available on our website: wdgpublichealth.ca/workplaces.
- The Ontario Ministry of Health (MOH) has <u>broadened the list of immunocompromised</u> <u>individuals</u> eligible for a third dose of COVID-19 vaccine. Physicians who are unable to administer vaccine to their eligible patients may complete the updated <u>referral form</u> for their patients to be immunized at a WDGPH clinic.
- The MOH is <u>recommending</u> that individuals who have received a complete or incomplete series of a COVID-19 vaccine that is not authorized for use by Health Canada receive an additional dose of mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna) in order to be considered <u>fully</u> vaccinated.
- The MOH has developed guidance for medical exemptions to COVID-19 vaccination.
- The <u>2021-22 Grade 7 and 8 School Vaccination Clinics</u> schedule and <u>FAQs</u> have been posted to the website and parents can be directed here to answer many of their questions.
- Distribution of the 2021-22 flu vaccine will roll-out with similar timeframes as the previous flu season. Co-administration of the flu vaccine with COVID-19 vaccine is still under review by the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI).

Vaccine Administration Updates

COVID-19 Vaccines Cheat Sheet (updated Sept. 9)

- Updated authorized ages for use.
 - Moderna has been approved for individuals 12 years of age and older.
 - Pfizer is preferred for use (over Moderna) for individuals aged 12-24 years.
- Updated contraindications for history of myocarditis/pericarditis after previous dose of COVID-19 vaccines.

COVID-19 Vaccine Third Dose Recommendations (updated Sept. 14)

- The MOH has expanded the third dose eligibility criteria for individuals who are moderately to severely immunocompromised.

COVID-19 Guidance for Individuals Vaccinated Outside of Ontario/Canada (updated Sept. 14)

- This guidance has been updated to align with the Public Health Agency of Canada's recommendations.
- Individuals who have received a complete or incomplete series of a COVID-19 vaccine that is not authorized for use by Health Canada require an additional dose of mRNA vaccine (Pfizer or Moderna).
