

# COVID-19 Vaccine Bulletin #36 Vaccine Updates

## **Quick Updates**

- Anyone born in 2009 or earlier can access COVID-19 vaccine:
  - 1. DROP-IN at any of the WDGPH clinic sites: wdgpublichealth.ca/drop-ins OR
  - 2. Book an appointment online: wdgpublichealth.ca/appointments OR
  - 3. Book an appointment over the phone: 1-800-265-7293, x7006 (Mon-Fri, 8am-4pm) OR
  - 4. Contact a participating pharmacy.
- The <u>National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI) recommends</u> that COVID-19 vaccines may be given at the same time as, or at any time before or after, non-COVID-19 vaccines (including live, non-live, adjuvanted, or unadjuvanted).
- Due to an increased risk of pericarditis/myocarditis among individuals 18-24 years old following vaccination with Moderna compared to Pfizer, the Ministry of Health (MOH) recommends that the Pfizer vaccine is preferentially administered to individuals who are 18-24 years old. If individuals aged 18 to 24 years old wish to receive Moderna, they can continue to do so with informed consent.
- Ontario will continue using the Pfizer vaccine for youth ages 12-17 (including those turning 12 in 2021) because there is more experience to date with this vaccine in this age group, and there is the possibility of a lower rate of myocarditis/pericarditis with Pfizer in this age group.
- Cancer Care Ontario has a <u>frequently asked questions document for COVID-19 and cancer</u>. It provides information about timing of the COVID-19 vaccine and third doses.
- REMINDER: The Ministry of Health (MOH) is <u>recommending</u> that individuals who have received a complete or incomplete series of a COVID-19 vaccine that is not authorized for use by Health Canada receive an additional dose of mRNA vaccine in order to be considered <u>fully vaccinated</u>.
- The MOH has developed a <u>sample statement of medical exemption</u>.
- WDGPH's Medical Officer of Health issued a <u>letter of instruction</u> requiring proof of vaccination for all individuals who support an indoor organized sport or recreational fitness activity including volunteers, coaches, instructors, coordinators, trainers, officials, and organizers.
- It is anticipated that distribution of flu vaccine will begin the week of October 4 with long term care tomes retirement homes and hospitals prioritized. Flu vaccine for primary care providers will follow soon after. The Influenza Vaccine Order Form is available HERE.
  - Note: Vaccine administrators may now consider co-administration of flu vaccine and COVID-19 vaccine with informed consent about benefits and risks.

#### Pfizer Announces Positive Results from Vaccine Trial for Children

Pfizer announced positive results from clinical trial of COVID-19 vaccine for children 5 to 11
years old showing that the vaccine was safe, well tolerated and showed robust neutralizing
antibody responses.

- Health Canada has authorized brand name changes for three COVID-19 vaccines, same vaccine just new brand names:
  - Pfizer-BioNTech → Comirnaty
  - Moderna → SpikeVax
  - AstraZeneca → Vaxzevria
